Affordability is without doubt a key factor when choosing the right medical scheme for you, but this should not mean you have to sacrifice freedom of choice when it comes to your healthcare providers.

As so many of our members pointed out in our Thanksgiving competition, with OMSMAF you do not have to sacrifice your budget to have choices, unlike other medical schemes that members have previously belonged to.

Because we know that the relationship between you and your healthcare service provider is special, we offer you as much choice as possible, other than our designated service providers for joint replacement and oncology. We do not have a specific specialist network, members on the network plans can use any network provider, and members on the *SELECT* plans may use any hospital in the *SELECT* Hospital Network. This means that the choice of a healthcare service provider rests solely with you and that you will not be faced with co-payments for consulting a non-network provider, other than those mentioned.

And did you know that OMSMAF also provides additional cover for non-PMB chronic conditions across the board, as well as specialised drug cover. On most medical schemes specialised medicine is only covered on the top option. At OMSMAF we cover you on all options including the Hospital Plan, Savings, Network, Traditional, Traditional *SELECT*, Traditional Plus and the Traditional Plus *SELECT* option. On the Hospital and Network Plan, only multiple sclerosis is covered.
